Established in 1941 by J.C. and Gladys Grier, the fine jewelry store on Broad Street was an integral part of the community and served generations of loyal customers who eventually became friends.

When J.C. and Gladys passed on, their sons, Garry and Marvin, continued the family tradition of service with integrity and grew the business. When Garry became ill, Marvin assumed full ownership of Gadsden's oldest jewelry store with his wife, Julie.

Through the years, the Griers adjusted to growth and change in their business, and further change propelled the family to move in yet another direction. With the whole-hearted support of their three grown children, Marvin and Julie decided to leave the jewelry store behind and were ready for a new adventure in their lives.

This is not a retirement, but a change of direction for the Griers. The degrees awarded Marvin by the GIA and AGS will help determine his paths to the future.

For a business that had such a rich, 68-year history and longtime family ties, it was difficult to consider closing the store forever. Grier Jewelers had been good to Marvin and Julie and to his brother and parents before them, but it was time for change.
