Founded in 1862 by the late Herman T. Jarecki, JARECKI'S JEWELERS became a fixture in downtown Erie, Pennsylvania at the height of the Civil War. The business weathered 28 U.S. presidents and more than 14 decades of change as well as six subsequent store owners. Erie's oldest jewelry store enjoyed its heritage of presenting fine jewelry, quality giftware and exceptional service to its many customers.

Les Craig, Jarecki's owner for the last nine years, wasn't there for the glory days, but he's heard all the stories. "The reputation is one of the reasons I purchased Jarecki's Jewelers," said Craig. "It had a quality-minded clientele in a town known for its thrift."

Craig, who closed his store for personal reasons, tried for more than a year to sell the business, fixtures, inventory and name, but was unable to reach a deal with the right buyer. That's when he decided to call Wilkerson and Associates
