After 17 successful years at their Fillmore location, Sonny's Diamonds & Jewelry announced the store's closure just prior to the 2008 holiday season. Wilkerson and Associates – the experts in transitional

"Closing our family jewelry business after 17 years was a difficult decision driven by our lease renewal and the significantly higher costs to remain at that location," said owner Michael Nedler. But the outpouring of community appreciation for the store led Nedler to rethink retirement and gave him the incentive to reinvent the traditional jewelry store into a great place to hang out – that also happens to sell great jewelry.

Nedler and business partner, Mark Allen, realized that, as times were changing, they needed to revolutionize the way people shop for jewelry. They sought new opportunities, a new concept and a new location...and when it all came together, *Sonny's Rocks* was born. So, while it was "goodbye", Sonny's

Diamonds & Jewelry, it became "hello, with a guitar riff and a tattoo", to Sonny's Rocks. This unique concept store, on the southwest corner of Colorado Boulevard and Florida Avenue in Denver, features rock videos, computer game consoles and barbecues and margaritas on the deck. The walls are adorned with guitars previously owned by world renowned musicians representing classic to contem-

porary genres. The store's design reflects the jewelry lines carried – from traditional to current styles.
